

## **Arizona Roundtrip Frequently Asked Questions**

- What is a Rotaract Roundtrip?

- How many spots are available?

- What does this trip cost? What does my participation fee include?

**\$300 USD** - due prior to your arrival (if selected). The fee covers all meals, transportation, welcome and departure bags, t-shirts, and national park and museum fees.

- When should I plan to arrive? Depart?

Plan to arrive 24-48 hours BEFORE May 14, to ensure you do not miss a single moment! We ask that all trippers plan their departure for May 26.

- Which airport should I fly into?

Phoenix Sky Harbor International Airport (Airport code: PHX)

- What should I pack?

Pack for hot weather, swimming, hiking, and everyday use. Also, be sure to pack a jacket/sweater and pair of pants for when we go to northern Arizona. There will be one formal night - we request guys pack a jacket and tie, and ladies wear a nice blouse or dress. Feel free to contact us if you have any questions regarding this topic.

- What will the weather be like during the trip?

The weather in Tempe, Arizona averages a high of 35°C during the day and 20°C at night. However, we will be traveling to northern Arizona where temperatures are cooler, averaging 29°C for the day, and 16°C at night. Please let us know if you have any questions regarding this topic.
